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### Educational Background

Dr. Kim earned her undergraduate degree from Harvard College and her medical degree from Stanford University School of Medicine. She completed her postgraduate training in internal medicine and gastroenterology at New York Presbyterian Hospital (Cornell).

### Professional Experience

Dr. Kim is currently Vice Chair for Faculty Affairs for the Department of Medicine at the Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai. She is Professor of Medicine and Co-Director of the Center for Carcinoid and Neuroendocrine Tumors. She has lectured nationally and internationally on carcinoid and neuroendocrine tumors and is known for her work in translational and epidemiologic approaches in assessing outcomes in these patients.

In August 2022, Dr. Kim will become Chair of the Department of Gastroenterology, Hepatology, and Nutrition at Cleveland Clinic.

### Other Experience and Professional Memberships

Dr. Kim is currently chair of the Carcinoid and Neuroendocrine Tumor Section of the American Gastroenterological Association and was the President of the New York Society for Gastrointestinal Endoscopy, the largest regional endoscopic society in the United States. She has received research funding from the American Cancer Society, the Neuroendocrine Tumor Research Foundation, the Mount Sinai CTSA and the Carcinoid Cancer Foundation. Dr. Kim has published more than 80 publications in journals such as the *Journal of Clinical Oncology*, *Gastroenterology*, and *NEJM Catalyst*. Dr. Kim has won numerous teaching awards and has mentored more than five dozen medical students, residents, gastroenterology fellows, and junior faculty.
